1. Overview

Nexstor is committed to achieving Net Zero emissions by 2044 at the latest.

Reducing our greenhouse gas emissions brings benefits for our customers, suppliers, our staff, as well as the wider community – both locally and globally. Our current carbon footprint is relatively small, due to our small (shared) office and limited corporate travel. Nevertheless, we are committed to ensuring our footprint remains as small as possible and eventually becoming net zero.

3. Commitments

We know that we cannot do this alone. We will work collaboratively with all stakeholders – staff and contractors within the Nexstor family, as well as external stakeholders (customers, supplier network, regulators), to ensure we meet our commitment. Key measures we have discussed already include:

-  Maintaining an Environmental Management System (EMS) that is certified by a UKAS accredited Certification Body to ISO 14001, including using an Environmental Aspects Register to measure all significant environmental impacts.
-  Working with our office landlord to maximise the energy efficiency of our office.
-  Seeking opportunities to work further with 'green' data centres.
-  Minimising corporate travel using alternative means (video conferencing, etc.) and using public transport in the first instance where travel is a necessity.
-  Reducing the number of deliveries (equipment, etc.) to our office.

-  Continue to educate our staff on how to reduce their carbon footprint in and out of the workplace.
-  Creating an Nexstor Sustainability Team to lead this project.
